1. Age represents the age a student turns in the 2026 calendar year.

2. Education fees are billed over 12 months. However, final year 15-18 Year AS/A Level students are billed the annual school fees over 10 months, not 12.

Education fees relate to the cost of the programme for an academic year (Montessori, Cambridge & IAQ) billed over a calendar year. Cambridge and IAQ exits are separately billable programmes. Should a student be on both programmes, both programme costs will be applicable and pro-rated as the case may be.

Programme fees are not discounted/rebated further if a student completes their studies earlier in the academic year.

If a student prolongs their programme pathway beyond an academic year/calendar year then the following year annual programme cost will be charged monthly, over and above the current annual programme cost, until the student completes their submission/exam.

School fees are payable via debit order, in advance, and are to be received on or before the 1st of each month. Generation Schools is a cash free zone.

Three debit order dates will be available to parents/guardians to pay for school fees in advance, specifically the 15th, 25th and 1st.

Fees received after the 1st of each month will be subject to a late payment fee of R550 per month and interest on outstanding balances will be charged at Prime + 2% per month.

Should any fees be outstanding in full or part for one or more months, the school will apply its formal debt recovery procedures. Should internal debt management processes be unsuccessful, and in the event of persistent non-payment, the school will instruct its debt collection attorneys to institute legal recovery proceedings. Such non-payment will also constitute a material breach of the school's terms and conditions, which may result in suspension and/or termination of enrolment.

If any educational fees are outstanding, optional services such as aftercare and lunch as well as school sport, matches, camps, etc. may be ceased.

Payments to the school are required to be gross of payment gateway transaction costs. Should a debit order be rejected, the account holder will be responsible for the associated transaction charges.

Owing to inter alia the existence of natural breakpoints in the academic calendar, resource and capacity planning in education services, and the difficulties in filling suddenly-vacant spaces during the year, one term's written notice (3 calendar months) is required if you decide to withdraw your child(ren) from school. Should you wish to withdraw your child from school on shorter notice for any reason whatsoever, you hereby accept that you will remain liable for the same fees in lieu of notice required but not given, and which you accept to be a reasonable cancellation penalty, alternatively early cancellation fee.

Additional costs include but are not limited to external examinations, checkpoints, textbooks, coursework components related to Cambridge and IAQs, remedial specialists, facilitators, invigilators, devices, calculators, elective extra-mural activities, senior's jacket and dance, camps, workshops, career advisement assessments, bus transport, uniforms, early care, lunch, afternoon snack, aftercare and holiday care.

3. The annual levies are payable in advance on or before 1 January.

Annual levies include printing, paper, stationery, workbooks, art consumables, Montessori materials, teaching resources and the Student learning and information platform.

4. Middle School refers to Stage 7 & 8 or Lower Secondary 1 & 2 in the Cambridge pathway (2 years), which is the 12-15 Phase.

5. The IGCSE, AS Levels and A Levels refers to the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) 1 & 2, Advanced Subsidiary (AS) 1 & 2 and Advanced Levels in the Cambridge pathway (4 years).

If a student commences the IGCSE, AS/A Level or IAQ pathway, the student will be billed according to the pathway and not age.

Cambridge IGCSE and AS/A Level external exams are written in the second year of each programme.

A Levels are only offered on merit and demand.

6. IAQ Full-time students are campus-based students that learn through the Student learning and information platform and are supplemented with face-to-face instruction.

7. IAQ Part-time offering refers to flexible time spent on campus based on the parent's/guardian's permission.

8. IAQ Distance students are home-based students that learn through the Student learning and information platform and have no campus interaction.

9. IAQs (International Access Qualifications) are a unique pathway exit offered to students as a powerful alternative to Cambridge/Matric equivalent.

IAQ costs relate to 120 credit programmes.

All IAQ programmes follow a suggested academic timeline but are asynchronous in nature, meaning that a student can progress at their own pace.

10. The monthly fee for IAQ courses must be paid in full for 12 months before a certificate can be issued to the student, unless the student completes their level sooner than the 12 months and continues studying with us for the next level. In this case only, the school will bill for the new course and not the completed course. The student will no longer be liable for the remaining fees for the completed course. A student is considered to have completed a course once all required work has been submitted to the qualifying body for certification. Completion does not occur at the end of teaching or the last day of class but is contingent on the submission of all assessments to the qualifying body. Should a student take longer than 12 months to complete the course, the monthly IAQ fee per the relevant year's fee structure will continue to be charged until the submission of all the student's assessments to the qualifying body.

The International Access Qualification (IAQ) fees will increase by 5% for existing IAQ cohorts that commenced before 1 January 2026 (e.g., in the 2025 calendar year).

New 2026 IAQ cohorts (e.g., commencing after 1 January 2026) will be charged according to the 2026 Fee Structure.

11. Lunch is optional in 1-3 Years, 3-6 Years and 6-9 Years. Please refer to the welcome pack and family charter for further information relating to our food policy.

Lunch for 1-3 Years, 3-6 Years and 6-9 Years is billed at a lower rate over 12 months and not at its actual rate over 9 school months, which means one calendar month notice to stop/pause is required.

12. Aftercare and holiday care is optional for all 0-12 Phases. Please ensure your child/ren have adequate food to last the school day, including aftercare and holiday care.

Aftercare does not include holiday care. Holiday care is an additional cost and is billed termly.

Students collected after the finishing time will incur a fee of R150 per 15 minutes or part thereof.

Ad hoc rates will be applicable where a service has been used but not selected in advance on the Student learning and information platform.

13. Early payment discounts are only applicable if the annual school fees (less the applicable discount) reflects in the Generation Schools' bank account on or before the specified date.

14. Foreign exchange students are required to pay all relevant fees termly in advance, including the registration and placement fees.

15. All students from 12-18 Phases are required to bring your own devices ('BYOD' Policy). All student devices brought onto campus must have administration rights signed over to the school for management purposes.

Devices are brought to school at own risk.

16. Sports, Arts, Cultural and Extra-Mural activities vary for certain phases- please inquire from the school for further information.

Elective Extra-Mural activities, school photographs and workshops are separately payable activities which will be facilitated via the Karri App, during the academic year.

Please inquire from the campus as to the finishing times of a particular phase.

17. The Cambridge exam fee structures are published separately.

18. Billing options can be amended on the Student learning and information platform. Otherwise, all finance queries to be directed to the finance department, either to your specific finance administrator and/or accounts@generationschools.co.za.

19. No failure, delay, relaxation or indulgence on the part of the school in exercising any power or right conferred on it shall operate as a waiver of such right.
